A WORD BY THE DEAN AND DIRECTOR

The year 2006 was marked by IEDC's 20th anniversary. After two decades of strong commitment to its vision, constant innovation and dedication to excellence, the IEDC-Bled School of Management has become an internationally respected institution, known for its holistic approach to management development, which includes input from the arts, science and a variety of professions, and its mission to be an important business meeting place in the CEE.

The School celebrated throughout the year with various events in Slovenia and abroad, all under the slogan Leadership for a Better World, in line with IEDC's continuous efforts to develop responsible leaders.

The highlight was the conference Leadership for a Better World, which brought together more than 400 business and political leaders, alumni and friends of the IEDC from 33 countries. On its 20th anniversary, IEDC is regarding the future and reflecting on the type of leadership that is needed for the sustainable future of companies and organizations, and for us all.

In the framework of the conference, Global Compact Slovenia was established. This is the Slovenian chapter of the world's largest corporate global citizenship network, which currently connects more than 2500 companies and NGOs from 80 countries. Its members bind themselves to respect human rights, labor standards and the environment in their actions. IEDC also issued a book, Leadership for a Better World, which contains the reflections of renowned academics, business and political leaders who have been linked to the School in various ways over the past 20 years.

The conference's keynote speaker, Dr. Ichak Adizes, stressed that "leadership for a better world" requires both complementary teams and collaborative leadership. Decision-making alone is not enough; we need to implement our decisions. Because of constant change, a common interest does not exist; we can, however, bring various interests together via mutual trust and respect, and the task of leaders is to build a culture that stimulates both.

In order to share Dr. Adizes' thoughts on leadership with you, we have given this year's Book of the Year a slightly different format: instead of a written text it includes a picture and a sound.

Dr. Ichak Adizes is one of the world's leading experts on improving the performance of business and government by making fundamental changes without the chaos and destructive conflict that accompany many such efforts. Over the past 35 years he has worked with some of the largest commercial organizations in the world and consulted with many heads of state. Dr. Adizes is the Founder and CEO of the Adizes Institute, a highly specialized change-management organization with offices in the US and 14 other countries around the world. Dr. Adizes is also a noted author and has lectured in four languages in over 40 countries.

His work has been featured in Inc. Magazine, Fortune, the New York Times, the Financial Times, Investor Relations Daily, Nation's Business, and World Digest. He is the author of seven books, which have been translated into 22 languages. His Corporate Lifecycles: How Organizations Grow and Die and What to Do About It (1988) is regarded as a classic in management theory and was selected as one of the 10 Best Business Books by The Library Journal. A revised edition was published in 1999 under the title Managing Corporate Lifecycles. Dr. Adizes' other books include The Pursuit of Prime (1996), Mastering Change: The Power of Mutual Trust and Respect in Personal Life, Family, Business and Society (1992), How to Solve the Mismanagement Crisis (1979), and Self-Management (1975). Dr. Adizes has a Ph.D. and MBA from Columbia University and a BA from Hebrew University. He works in English, Spanish, Hebrew, Serbian, Croatian, and Bosnian, and also understands Bulgarian and Portuguese.

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
