You've got a long career in Romanian media. Could you please tell us a bit how did your path evolve? You started at the sports newspaper and nowadays are running a TV station, aren't you? However, you did not really work in any journalist positions, but on managerial ones. How come?

I started my career at a time when there was a change of generations in management positions, therefore, I became the Executive Manager of the newspaper in my early 20s. I got my MBA diploma, and I shifted to corporate development positions buying, selling, and launching media products in Romania abroad. Μv and 3-year extensive work for the World Association of Newspapers, based in Paris, gave me a thorough understanding of media business at a global level. With this experience and understanding of media, even if I wanted to downsize, I could not have. Did you always imagine yourself working in the media?

I imagined myself running a business. I was an A student all my life. Yet very early in my life (in primary and secondary schools) my teachers and professors gave me leadership positions, long before I realized that I have leadership skills and that my colleagues respect me and follow me.

Back in 2002, you have enrolled into the IEDC-Bled School of Management. How did you learn about IEDC and why did you decide to come study to Slovenia?

After I got my Master's Diploma Marketing, in wanted continue my to education by doing an MBA. I found out about the IEDC from Cristian Gheorghe, who was my professor at the University of Economics, and an alumnus of the IEDC. He was the one who persuaded me to apply to the school, telling me that professors and the quality of the program were outstanding. And he was so right about it. 

This program is a great preparation for a real business world. I remember partying in clubs during weekends. I even remember the romances there:) I do keep in touch with my colleagues. There were 9 Romanians in my generation at the IEDC - Bled School of Management and we meet regularly. And I just saw most of my colleagues when we celebrated 20 years since our graduation in Bled.

Being a successful manager usually means a busy schedule, but also mastering the art of balancing work and family affairs. What's your recipe to doing well? What are you relaxation techniques that help you cope with pressure?

Work-life balance is a daily challenge. I learnt to stop working after 8 hours. There would always be a lot of work still to be done, so you just have to stop. My alarm rings at 5 p.m., reminding me to rush to the gym as my trainer is waiting for me. A personal trainer is my big secret. If I promised him to be there at 6 p.m., I must keep my word:)

Mentally detaching from work issues is also very difficult. I try

to meditate every morning. And every time I take a break, I repeat in my mind a few phrases: My mind is peaceful, my emotions are calm, my body is relaxed. It works for me as I manage to stop thinking about how to solve certain things at work.
